Summary of Evaluation:

Teaching – Professor Cattaneo is an outstanding teacher. He is a key instructor for core econometrics courses at the graduate level taken in economics and a range of related fields. Professor Cattaneo has prepared a total of six new courses at the 400 and 600 levels during his time at Michigan, which is an unusually high number. These courses include both undergraduate and graduate courses ranging from core courses for all Ph.D. students to advanced field courses on the most technical subjects and quantitative methods courses. His courses are widely praised and student evaluations are very strong across the board. Professor Cattaneo helped revitalize the study of theoretical econometrics, training and placing the first student specializing in advanced econometric theory to graduate from Michigan in several decades.

Research – Professor Cattaneo has made important contributions to theoretical econometrics. He has published extensively and now serves on the editorial teams for several major field journals. He is recognized as the one of the world’s leading experts on “robustifying” classical semi-parametric inference. Professor Cattaneo’s work has important implications for the application of the widely used regression-discontinuity designs, providing bridges between statistical theory and empirical social science research.
