Subject: Central Student Government (CSG) Report

President Schlissel, members of the Board of Regents, and Executive Officers of the University,

I am pleased and honored to submit the following report to you on behalf of the Central Student Government (CSG). Below is an update on the work of CSG this past month:

#### Recent and On-Going CSG Projects

#### • Reusable Grocery Bags:

 In order to boost sustainability at a student level, CSG is working to purchase reusable grocery bags (in partnership with Beyond the Diag) to distribute to off-campus students in the Fall Semester. Further, CSG plans on donating these bags to the Maize and Blue Cupboard. This is a small step in CSG's larger goal this upcoming year of enhancing sustainability efforts across the student body.

#### • Maize and Blue Cupboard:

• The Maize and Blue Cupboard, Ann Arbor's student food pantry, has had great success in its first two months. The cupboard has serviced over 1,600 University students, offering basic foods as well as toiletries. CSG plans on continuing collaboration with the Maize and Blue, and hopes to continue to work with the Board to address food insecurity on campus.

#### • Government Relations Coordinator:

In the Fall Semester, CSG's Executive Team will be creating a new position—the Government Relations Coordinator. This role will be dedicated to outreach with the State Legislature and Federal Government, and will function as the voice of the Ann Arbor student body to government entities and officials. They will also work on 2020 GOTV efforts.

Further, CSG is pursuing efforts surrounding student wellness, campus affordability, resource accessibility, and DEI for the Fall.
