## REQUEST FOR ACTION

**Subject**: Regental Action Under the State of Michigan Conflict of Interest Statute

Action Requested: Authorize Execution of Investment Agreements Under the MINTS Program for Ecovia

Renewables Inc.

## **Background**

In December 2011, the Board of Regents approved guidelines for the MINTS ("Michigan Investment in New Technology Startup") program.

The proposed investment agreements (the "Agreements") fall under the State of Michigan Conflict of Interest Statute because the listed Interested Individual is both an employee of the University and has a sufficient pecuniary interest in the Agreements as partial owner of the company and member of the Board of Directors. The law permits such an agreement provided it is disclosed to the executive officers and approved in advance by a 2/3 vote of the Board of Regents.

The parties to the Agreements include the University and the entity listed below. The University will receive an equity interest in the entity in return for its investment(s).

No use of University services or facilities, nor any assignment of University employees, is obligated or contemplated under the Agreements. Agreements standard for venture capital investing will be executed.

The Investment Office is seeking approval for financing agreements up to a total of \$5 million in potential investments (through one or more rounds of financing) under MINTS for the following startup:

Ecovia Renewables Inc., founded in 2014, and headquartered in Ann Arbor, MI, develops an affordable biobased, biodegradable, and functional alternative to conventional acrylate and acrylamide polymers. Ecovia™ Biopolymers are produced through fermentation of renewable biomass and have a wide range of applications from specialty to commodity chemicals.
