Guohua Xi, M.D., professor of neurosurgery and program associate, Crosby Neurosurgical Laboratories, in the Medical School, retired from active faculty status on February 28, 2025.

Professor Xi received his M.D. from Zhejiang Medical University in 1985. He joined the University of Michigan faculty as a research investigator in 1998, and was promoted to assistant research scientist in 2000, research assistant professor in 2003, research associate professor in 2004, associate professor in 2005, Richard C. Schneider Research Professor of Neurosurgery in 2009, and professor in 2011.

Dr. Xi has extensive experience in stroke models and intracerebral hemorrhage. He has received at least 14 RO1 grants and over 226 peer-reviewed journal articles. Dr. Xi received the American Heart Association Established Investigator Award four years in a row (2008-2012). He served as a grant reviewer for the National Institutes of Health (NIH), the American Heart Association (AHA), the National Institute of Biomedical Imaging and Bioengineering (NIBIB) during his outstanding career. Dr. Xi has mentored over 100 students, visiting scholars, residents and postdoctoral fellows.
