### Summary of Evaluation:

Teaching: Dr. Smith has been actively involved in the educational activities of medical students, house officers, and fellows. She has taught and mentored medical students and residents through clinical rotations and didactic lectures. She has been an integral part of the development of the successful and competitive reproductive endocrinology fellowship. In addition, she serves as a mentor for two T32 programs, the Building Interdisciplinary Research Careers in Women's Health (BIRCWH) K12 program, and the MICHR Postdoctoral Translational Scholars Program. She has participated in several University of Michigan CME activities, including grand rounds, annual postgraduate courses, and the Osteoporosis Guideline Committee. Dr. Smith consistently receives high scores (4.0 or above, out of 5) and positive comments regarding her teaching of medical students, house officers, and fellows. Comments have included: "Dr. Smith is a phenomenal teacher, clearly invested in resident education. I appreciate that she also shows interest in our development as well as well rounded physicians—a treat to work with...She spends time teaching from clinical, research and surgical standpoints...Dr. Smith has a clear and effective teaching style...Dr. Smith is an outstanding role model and encourages trainees to

maximize their potential clinically and in the research realm...Dr. Smith has it all. She's brilliant, professional, kind, caring and a great communicator and above all mentor."

Research: Dr. Yolanda Smith's research focuses on the integration of reproductive endocrinology with brain function and neurochemistry. Currently, she has federal research funding through an R01 award from the National Institute on Aging (NIA) to study the normal brain functional changes that occur during the menopause transition. It is anticipated that she will receive continued NIH funding to longitudinally study this group of subjects. Additionally, an R21 award from the NIA supports a mechanistic study of the individual effects of estrogen and progesterone therapy in early menopausal women. In addition, she is a co-investigator for R01s that study the effects of reproductive hormones on brain neurochemistry in depressed women and the study of the opioid system function in chronic pain patients.

Service: Dr. Smith is a fellow of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists. She is an active member of the American Society for Reproductive Medicine, the North American Society for Pediatric and Adolescent Gynecology, and the Society for Gynecologic Investigation. She serves as an ad hoc reviewer for numerous peer-review medical journals, including the Journal of Clinical Endocrinology and Metabolism, Fertility and Sterility, International Journal of Gynecology and Obstetrics, Journal of Pediatric and Adolescent Gynecology, Biological Psychiatry, and Journal of the International Neuropsychological Society. Institutionally, she holds leadership roles in research, serving as the associate chair for research (Clinical and Health Services) in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology and as a member of the Michigan Institute for Clinical and Health Research (MICHR) Scientific Advisory Committee, Education and Career Development Core Admissions Committee, and Senior Leadership Committee. In

addition, she has served on the Medical School Admissions Committee since 2000. Dr. Smith has also served as the research director of the University of Michigan Center of Excellence in Women's Health and co-director for the University of Michigan Women's Health Registry. Nationally, she has served on program committees, abstract selection committees and on prize poster/paper selection committees. In particular, she served as the 2009 scientific program chair for the North American Society for Pediatric and Adolescent Gynecology (NASPAG) Annual Clinical Meeting with international speakers and attendees. She also was elected to serve on the Women's Council of the American Society for Reproductive Medicine (ASRM). In addition, she serves as an ad hoc reviewer for the National Institute on Aging (NIA) Special Emphasis Panels and serves on the editorial boards of the *Journal of Women's Health* and *The Biology of Sex Differences*.

Dr. Smith's clinical expertise is in reproductive endocrinology and infertility, with a special interest in pediatric and adolescent gynecology. She has served as the co-director of the Pediatric and Adolescent Gynecology Clinic since 1995, training both obstetric/gynecology and pediatric residents. She has also served as president, program chair, and secretary of the Pediatric and Adolescent Special Interest Group of the American Society for Reproductive Medicine (ASRM), and has held leadership roles in the North American Society for Pediatric and Adolescent Gynecology (NASPAG). Dr. Smith's clinical practice also includes private patients seen within the Center for Reproductive Medicine (CRM) for treatment of infertility, developmental problems of the reproductive tract, menopause and hormone therapy. In addition, Dr. Smith actively participates in the treatment of patients seen within the Division of Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility covering fellow continuity clinics, surgical procedures, and weekend coverage of ultrasounds and assisted reproductive technology at the Center for Reproductive Medicine. One week each month, she takes responsibility for the clinical management of all CRM patients undergoing in vitro fertilization and ovulation induction.
