Summary of Evaluation:

Teaching: Dr. Schoenfeld is a dedicated teacher. He teaches and mentors medical students, internal medicine residents, gastroenterology fellows and junior faculty in the Division of Gastroenterology. He initiated and continues to coordinate the bi-weekly GI Clinical Research Conference series which is devoted to teaching GI fellows how to conduct clinical research. One indicator of his teaching excellence is his receipt of the Outstanding Research Mentor Award (2008) by GI fellows. An additional excellence indicator is the fact that several of his junior faculty mentees have successfully applied for career development awards in GI cancer screening. Dr. Schoenfeld serves expertly as the principal investigator of the NIDDK T32-sponsored training program in GI epidemiology with over 90% of the graduating fellows choosing a career in academic medicine. At the national and international level, Dr. Schoenfeld has served as the course director for multiple national and international CME courses, including the American Gastroenterological Association (AGA) spring post-graduate course in Orlando, Florida and the AGA post-graduate course at the World Congress of Gastroenterology in Montreal. His national and international stature is clear upon review of the significant number of visiting professorships and extramural invited presentations. Dr. Schoenfeld has written extensively on evidence-based medicine and epidemiology of gastrointestinal diseases. He has co-authored American College of Gastroenterology (ACG) guidelines on colorectal cancer (CRC) screening and irritable bowel syndrome (IBS). These guidelines are widely cited and serve as a measure of the educational value the guidelines provide gastroenterologists all over the world.

Research: Dr. Schoenfeld is well known for his research focused on patient-oriented and outcomes research in CRC screening and drug treatment and epidemiology of IBS. Further, he has adapted his skills in epidemiology and data analysis to become well-known in several fields as evidenced by the important studies he has published in several other gastroenterological disease areas. His overall scholarly approach is to identify gaps in clinical knowledge and practice and then design comprehensive studies to address the knowledge and practice gaps. His evidenced-based medicine approach and related findings have impacted a large portion of almost all gastroenterology practices. Further, his work has important impact on medical economics and national healthcare policy. Dr. Schoenfeld is well funded by federal grants and has consistently published in highly ranked journals. His work has been extensively cited. He has continuously contributed innovative science concepts which address the day-to-day management of GI problems and the related clinical outcomes.

Dr. Schoenfeld is a board certified gastroenterologist. His clinical efforts focus on treating IBS patients in the Specialized Functional Bowel Disorder Clinic. His clinical focus enables him to expand his research efforts to study effective and safe IBS treatments through a series of meta-analyses and outcomes research studies.


