Summary of Evaluation:

Teaching: Student evaluations for Professor Westphal affirm that she is an effective and greatly admired teacher. Her sheer dedication to her students and willingness to give of her time practically leaps off the pages of such evaluations and of the many effusive letters written by students on her behalf. Her pedagogical approach appears to be defined by just the right balance of high expectations, constructive criticism, and helpful encouragement. Furthermore, she effectively draws upon both her background as a classical pianist and her deep knowledge of and experience with contemporary popular music and musical theatre repertoire. This combination is rare among her peers, and it affords her students the opportunity to learn a variety of techniques across a range of diverse musical genres. Professor Westphal consistently offers training and professional development opportunities for her students by bringing renowned Broadway stage performers to campus. Indeed, her continued engagement with the world of Broadway and her successful teaching in a university setting provide her students with an inspiring example of the potential richness of a career that combines academic and professional endeavors.

Creative Activities: Professor Westphal's list of professional achievements is extraordinary. Her decade-long involvement with theatre on Broadway has included work on such productions as Miss Saigon (keyboardist), The Lion King (associate music director, assistant conductor, and keyboardist), A Christmas Story: The Musical (assistant conductor and keyboardist), and the Tony Awards ceremony (associate music director and keyboardist). Professor Westphal has also conducted and performed in several Broadway national tours, including productions of Sister Act, Les Misérables, Legally Blonde, Wicked, Peter Pan, Annie, The King and I, and Thoroughly Modern Millie, among others. She can also be heard as a keyboardist on recordings associated with certain of these productions and, in that same role, has made television appearances on Good Morning America and The Rosie Show with Rosie O'Donnell. In addition, Professor Westphal lent her talents to the 1998 Grammy Award-winning cast album of The Lion King (Buena Vista Records) and to the 2002 Telarc release of Celluloid Copland, which received a Grammy nomination for Best Classical Crossover Album. She has also been featured as music director and pianist on several student recordings.

including Dance With Me, which features the music of the rock group Air Supply. Professor Westphal has been active close to home, performing in several concerts at the Kerrytown Concert House in Ann Arbor and in concerts put on by the Department of Musical Theatre and the School of Music, Theatre & Dance.

Service: Professor Westphal's record of service at the School of Music, Theatre & Dance includes membership on several faculty search committees, a three-year term as an alternate to the Council of Departmental Representatives, and the presentation of an annual guest lecture as part of the MPulse Musical Theatre Program. In addition, she frequently serves as pianist for fundraising events, such as the Friends of Musical Theatre Donor Event, and for university-wide events, including the Martin Luther King Day celebration at the Power Center and commencement exercises, both for SMTD and the university as a whole. Extending her commitment to service beyond the university, Professor Westphal has given volunteer performances and benefit concerts at, among other organizations, the Jewish Community Center of Greater Ann Arbor, Safe House of Ann Arbor, and the Ann Arbor Hebrew Day School. She is a member of the American Federation of Musicians, Local 802 (New York City) and Local 5 (Detroit), and is also a member of the Theatre Musicians Association and the National Association of Teachers of Singing.

It is with great enthusiasm and with the full support of the School of Music, Theatre & Dance Executive Committee that I recommend Cynthia L. Westphal for promotion to associate professor of music, with tenure, Department of Musical Theatre, School of Music, Theatre & Dance.
