<u>Summary of Evaluation</u>:

<u>Teaching:</u> Dr. Meurer designed and implemented the National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke (NINDS) Clinical Trials Methodology Course in collaboration with a team from Iowa and the University of California, Los Angeles, and is the course director. It provides practice instruction to 25-40 trainees per year. The goal of the course is to improve the pipeline of clinical investigators conducting clinical trials and to improve the science that is conducted within early phase clinical trials in neurology, emergency medicine, and neurosurgery. Institutionally, he currently is an Advanced Trauma Life Support instructor, and annually lectures to the emergency medicine residents. Dr. Meurer is the course director of the Emergency Medicine Residency Journal Club, which is a valued component of the core lecture series. During clinical shifts in the Emergency Department, he teaches residents, fellows and medical students. He has also mentored medical students, residents, junior faculty,

undergraduate and graduate students. Many of these mentees have published peer-reviewed articles and presented at national and international meetings.

<u>Research</u>: Dr. Meurer's research focuses on improving the clinical outcomes of patients with acute neurological conditions, improving the process of care delivery in the Emergency Department for sudden neurological and vestibular conditions, and conceptualizing, designing, and implementing innovation adaptive clinical trial designs to accelerate the discovery of new treatments. He has been continuously well-funded by the NIH, clinical trials, foundation and institutional grants. The Blue Ridge Institution for Medical Research named Dr. Meurer as the highest funded principal investigator primarily appointed in the specialty of emergency medicine in 2019. He uses his unique strengths in neurology and methodology to contribute to a number of projects and advancement of others. He has built a successful clinical research program of collaborative science that cuts across and integrates three pillars: 1) research and education to advance trial methodology, 2) development and improvement to acute therapies for neurological emergencies, and 3) the study of how physicians and patient behavior interact with both novel therapies and research methods. Dr. Meurer has received the Society for Academic Emergency Medicine Mid-Career Investigator Award, and the University of Michigan Frankel Cardiovascular Center Directors Awards of Excellence 2018 Stroke Education Award.

<u>Service</u>: Dr. Meurer provides academic service to the department, medical school, health system and the national community. Nationally, he is a member of the Clinical Practice Committee for the American Academy of Emergency Medicine, Neurological Emergencies Interest Group for the Society of Academic Emergency Medicine. Internationally, he is a panelist of the Adaptive Designs CONSORT Extension. Institutionally, he is a member of the Stroke Quality Assurance Committee, Emergency Medicine Instructional Promotions Committee, and COVID-19 Clinical Trial Feasibility Review Committee. Dr. Meurer serves as a senior editor consultant for the *American Journal of Emergency Medicine*, as senior editor of *Trials*, as associate editor for the *Annals of Emergency Medicine*, and as associate editor for *Clinical Trials*. He is a journal reviewer for ten journals, including the *Annals of Emergency Medicine*, the *American Journal of Emergency Medicine*, and *Academic Emergency Medicine*. He is an active member of the American Heart Association Established Investigator Board Review Panel, the National Institutes of Health Center for Scientific Review Special Emphasis Panel Small Businesses: Drug Discovery for Aging, Neuropsychiatric and Neurologic Disorders, and NIH Health Services Organization and Delivery Review Board. Dr. Meurer serves on the board of directors of the Society for Clinical Trials, which is an international group focused on improving the design and implementation of trials and was the co-lead of the program committee for the International Clinical Trials Methodology Conference in Liverpool.
