Action Requested: Adoption of Retirement Memoir

**Steven F. Myers, Ph.D.**, professor of biology in the College of Arts and Sciences, University of Michigan-Flint, retired from active faculty status on May 31, 2019.

Professor Myers received his B.S. degree in biology from the University of California at Davis in 1972, his M.S. degree in biology from San Diego State University in 1978, his Ph.D. degree in anatomy and cell biology from the University of Michigan in 1983, and his post-doctoral training in vestibular neurophysiology at the University of California at Berkeley from 1983-86. His career with the University of Michigan began in 1991 as a visiting lecturer in Ann Arbor. He joined the University of Michigan-Flint faculty in 1991 as an adjunct assistant professor and became an assistant professor of biology in 1992. He was promoted to associate professor of biology in 1997 and professor of biology in 2004.

Professor Myers was a dedicated teacher of biology, known for his concern for his students and their academic success. For over a decade, he served as the chair of the Department of Biology. He also maintained the university's cadaver lab, a vital resource for not only biology students, but for School of Nursing and College of Health Sciences students as well. Throughout his career, he served on innumerable faculty standing committees, ad hoc committees, and task forces across the university.

The Regents now salute this distinguished faculty member by naming **Steven F. Myers**, **professor emeritus of biology**.
