May 2023 Regents Report

President Ono, Members of the Board of Regents, and Executive Officers of the University, it is our honor to submit the following report to you on behalf of the administration of University of Michigan-Dearborn's Student Government (SG). We look forward to updating you on our initiatives and sharing all that we have worked on.

Accomplishments:

The Student Government, in collaboration with faculty and staff, organized a successful sustainability fair that raised \$300 for donations to the Environmental Interpretive Center. We also purchased four caps and gowns for seniors who could not afford them. Additionally, we planted two trees for the Chancellor's reappointment. Student Government reached out to high school student councils to demonstrate the importance of leadership and community involvement. Senators packed 300 Ramadan baggies and 500 exam baggies for students studying, which were distributed across campus.

Amendments:

The Student Government passed an amendment that changes its structure, including the introduction of a new position called Director of Technology. The Public Relations Committee is now the Outreach Committee, which focuses on informing students about Student Government. The Director of Technology is responsible for producing flyers and controlling all social media outlets. Another amendment recommends each committee in the Student Government to have an advisor to work with them. This amendment ensures that the committees operate efficiently and effectively. An Executive Resolution passed by the Student Government states that we will work with the Dearborn Support office in purchasing and donating caps and gowns until the needs of all students are met. We also organized a campus-wide event to collect public comments on the inclusion of a Middle East North Africa (MENA) box on the US census form.

To Conclude:

Student Government is committed to serving and representing the student body. We have achieved several notable accomplishments and have important projects in the works. We hope to continue our efforts to make the college community a better place for all students.
