Summary of Evaluation:

Teaching: Professor Perkins is the director of percussion, and in that role coordinates instruction for the area with other percussion faculty, manages staff and student employees, organizes performances, brings in guest artists, oversees the maintenance of a large inventory of percussion instruments, and coordinates student activities and collaborative projects involving percussion, of which there are many. He is also very active in the commissioning of new works for percussion and creates opportunities for students to engage with professional composers. He teaches individual lessons, Percussion Ensemble, and Percussion Literature, and is an advisor and mentor for undergraduate and graduate percussion majors. He is also the co-director of the Michigan Youth Percussion Ensemble and co-director of the MPulse Percussion Institute. Through this activity, Professor Perkins has created a strong and unified culture in the percussion area focused on student success, creative agency, and artistic excellence. His teaching philosophy is built on the principles of diversity, equity and inclusion and is evidenced by his commitment to commissioning and incorporating works from underrepresented composers and tailoring his instruction to the needs of individual students. A current student wrote, "As an international student and a minority, I have always felt validated and accounted for by Dr. Perkins."

Since his arrival at UM, Professor Perkins has partnered with his junior colleague in percussion to reshape the curriculum to better serve student needs as they prepare for varied professional outcomes. Initiatives include the creation of new courses, such as the History of Percussion, and opportunities for

students to engage with the MPULSE summer program. Most significantly, Professor Perkins has worked tirelessly to involve SMTD percussion students in professional projects that provide highly visible, real-world experiences. Under Professor Perkins' leadership, the UM Percussion Ensemble: performed on the Grammy-nominated 2022 recording of John Luther Adams' work entitled "Sila: The Breath of the World," produced a recording used in a performance by the Limon Dance Company at the Joyce Theatre in New York City on the occasion of the company's 75th anniversary, and; performed at prominent national venues such as Mass Moca, PS 21, the Caramoor Festival, Princeton University, June in Buffalo, and PASIC, the annual conference of the Percussive Arts Society, the largest professional gathering of its kind. One student enthused that under Professor Perkins' leadership Michigan is now "The Place' every percussionist would want to study..."

<u>Professional Activities</u>: As a founding member of Sō Percussion, Professor Perkins has been an international figure in the field for over two decades. Through his frequent performances with leading new music ensembles such as Eighth Blackbird, Latitude 49, Ensemble Signal, and the Meehan/Perkins Duo, he has furthered his reputation as a leading new-music percussionist. His work is captured on 24 recordings as a soloist, ensemble member, conductor and producer, a number of which have been recognized as a top recording of the year by *NPR*, *The New York Times*, *AllMusic*, and the *Guardian*. As an advocate for new music, Professor Perkins has commissioned and premiered over 100 new works, including those by Pulitzer Prize-winning composers. Professor Perkins has performed in the most prestigious venues in the U.S., including Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, the Kennedy Center, Merkin Recital Hall, and The Shed, and has concertized throughout Europe, Russia, Brazil and Mexico. He has appeared regularly at leading new music festivals, such as the Bang on a Can Institute, and the annual Percussive Arts Society International Convention. He remains active as an orchestral and large ensemble musician, as well, and appears frequently with the Chicago Symphony, and most recently, with the Detroit Chamber Winds.

Professor Perkins' most impressive recent highlights include being nominated for a 2022 Grammy Award as the director and producer of John Luther Adams' music "Sila: The Breath of the World" (Cantaloupe Music), a recording that was also included on the 2022 Bandcamp "Top Contemporary Classical Albums" list. This recording features the UM Percussion ensemble, and other SMTD musicians, as well as The Crossing, a seven-time Grammy-nominated professional choir, and the JACK Quartet, an ensemble widely considered as the preeminent new-music string quartet in the world.

Since his appointment at STMD, Professor Perkins has contributed to eight recordings as a conductor, composer, producer, director, and performer. During that same time period, he also has 13 live chamber/ensemble appearances and another five as a soloist or conductor. Since 2020, he has been invited to coach, give a masterclass, or hold a residency 15 times across the U.S. (some virtual due to the pandemic.)

Professor Perkins is a virtuoso performer and collaborator who sustains a vibrant, multi-faceted career at the center of the global new music scene. He has admirably engaged his SMTD colleagues and students in collaborative projects that have gained national and international recognition. Professor Perkins is a dynamic artistic force within SMTD, and across the rapidly evolving field of contemporary classical music.

<u>Service</u>: Beyond the significant service that he provides to SMTD as the director of percussion, Professor Perkins has made valued contributions in leadership and service during this time at SMTD. He has acted as departmental representative on SMTD's undergraduate curriculum committee, served

on a search committee, and performed at many school-wide recruitment and development events. Active in his field as well, he has served on the Board of Advisors and International Solo Competition Committee for the Percussive Arts Society. Professor Perkins is a generous colleague with excellent administrative skills.

Reviewer A: "...I find the quality and quantity of Doug's scholarly efforts to be significant. While having firmly established himself as an outstanding chamber musician his activities as soloist, as joint concerto soloist, and as conductor/organizer cement him as an important artist in our field.
