
**Christin Carter-Su, M.S., Ph.D.**, Anita H. Payne Distinguished University Professor of Physiology, Henry Sewall Collegiate Professor of Physiology, professor of molecular and integrative physiology, and professor of internal medicine in the Medical School, retired from active faculty status on March 31, 2025.

Dr. Carter-Su received her Sc.B. from Brown University in 1972. Upon graduation, she took her studies to the University of Rochester, pursuing both an M.S. (1974) and a Ph.D. in biophysics (1978). Dr. Carter-Su joined the faculty at the University of Michigan as an assistant professor (1981- 87) and associate professor (1987-92) before attaining the rank of professor in 1992. In 2012, Dr. Carter-Su was named the Henry Sewall Collegiate Professor of Physiology, and the following year, she was named the Anita H. Payne Distinguished University Professor of Physiology. Dr. Carter-Su was appointed to the Department of Internal Medicine, Division of Metabolism, Endocrinology and Diabetes as a professor in 2013, a title she continues to hold.

Professor Carter-Su is recognized internationally for her pioneering work on the cellular actions of growth hormone, the hormone most responsible for overall body growth and height. She has received multiple prestigious awards for her scientific contributions. As the associate director of the NIH-funded Michigan Diabetes Research Center for almost 30 years, she helped expand it to over 150 members and leverage its resources to maximally support the research of its members through ever-evolving core services, symposia, and research groups. Her local, national, and international mentoring efforts have been recognized by the Sarah Goddard Power Award (1999) and the Aspire, Advance and Achieve Mentoring Award (2016), both from the University of Michigan, and a Mentoring Award from the Women in Endocrinology (2018).

The Regents now salute this distinguished faculty member by naming **Christin Carter-Su, professor emerita of molecular and integrative physiology and professor emerita of internal medicine.**
