**Subject: Report of Faculty Retirement**

**Action Requested: Adoption of Retirement Memoir**

**Ali M. Elkateeb, Ph.D.**, associate professor of electrical and computer engineering in the College of Engineering and Computer Science, University of Michigan-Dearborn, retired from active faculty status on January 31, 2025.

Professor Elkateeb received his B.Sc. in electrical engineering from the University of Technology in Baghdad in 1976. He earned his M.S. in computer and communication engineering from the University of Kent at Canterbury in 1980 and his Ph.D. in computer engineering from Concordia University in Montreal in 1992. Professor Elkateeb joined the University of Michigan-Dearborn in 2000 as an associate professor of electrical and computer engineering (without tenure) and was promoted to associate professor of electrical and computer engineering (with tenure) in 2005.

Professor Elkateeb's teaching and research interests are in the areas of sensor networks, high-speed networks, network processors, computer and architecture and design, reconfigurable computing, very large scale integration (VLSI) design, and field programmable gate array-based applications. Prior to joining the university, he worked as an associate professor with the School of Computer Science at Acadia University and as a senior application-specific integrated circuit engineer and design engineer for Mentalogic System Inc. and Air Tools, Inc. (ATI) Technologies, respectively. He is a part-owner of C2I Technologies in Windsor, Ontario.

Professor Elkateeb is an active member of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers. He was named Professor of the Year by the School of Computer Science at Acadia University in 1997/1998 and 1998/1999 and won the Time Warp Project Award from ATI Technologies in 1993.

The Regents now salute this distinguished teacher and scholar by naming **Ali M. Elkateeb, associate professor emeritus of electrical and computer engineering.**
