### Subject: Report of Faculty Retirement

#### Action Requested: Adoption of Retirement Memoir

**Laurel E. Moore, M.D.**, clinical professor of anesthesiology and clinical professor of neurosurgery in the Medical School, retired from active faculty status on June 30, 2026.

Dr. Moore was a member of the tenth Inteflex Class (Integrated Premedical-Medical Program) and graduated from the University of Michigan with a B.A. in 1983 and M.D. in 1986. After completing her residency in anesthesiology and fellowship in neuroanesthesia and neurocritical care at The Johns Hopkins Hospital. Dr. Moore was appointed as an instructor at The Johns Hopkins Hospital in 1991 and was promoted to assistant professor in 1992. Dr. Moore returned to the University of Michigan in 2007 as clinical assistant professor in anesthesiology. She was promoted to clinical associate professor in the Department of Anesthesiology in 2013, appointed as a clinical associate professor in the Department of Neurosurgery in 2016, and promoted to clinical professor in the departments of anesthesiology and neurosurgery in 2019.

Dr. Moore's academic career has focused on three primary areas. Her passion and expertise in the care of critically ill neurosurgical patients have remained at the center of her academic work. Closely aligned with this, her clinical and research interests focus on stroke, beginning with investigating the potential of anesthetic agents to ameliorate neurologic injury from induced focal ischemia to her national recognition as a clinical expert in perioperative stroke. Dr. Moore's third area of focus is medical education and faculty mentorship. Her success in these areas is demonstrated by her multiple substantive teaching and mentorship awards, leadership positions in medical education, and most recently, her position as assistant dean for clinical track faculty for the Medical School. In this role Dr. Moore represented and advocated for over 2,300 clinical faculty in all areas of their academic lives, including academic promotion, clinical support, and career well-being.

The Regents now salute this distinguished faculty member by naming **Laurel E. Moore, clinical professor emerita of anesthesiology and clinical professor emerita of neurosurgery.**
