## REPORT ON FACULTY SALARY

This report of the Committee on the Economic Status of the Faculty (CESF) focuses on two related issues: market equity and salary compression. The committee bases comparisons on the *National Faculty Salary Survey: Multi-Discipline Report 2005-2006* produced by the College and University Professional Association for Human Resources (CUPA). Under separate cover, the SACUA/Faculty Senate Office on the Ann Arbor campus provides summary salary data by rank and gender for each academic unit.

Our key conclusion is that salary compression experienced by UM-Dearborn faculty is significantly worse than at comparable universities. Further, we estimate redressing this inequity will cost about \$928,000 immediately plus a continuing commitment to preserve equity in the future. An alternative equity strategy--raising all salaries of faculty in disciplines currently paid below the comparison universities--will cost about \$1.4 million.

These equity issues are summarized in four graphs. The graphs are printed in Appendix A. The first graph is "Full Professor Salaries." Each point on the graph represents the mean salary of faculty of a given rank (in this graph full professors) in a given CUPA discipline category. CUPA discipline categories roughly correspond to UM-Dearborn disciplines, or in some cases departments. For more detail about the data used in the graphs, refer to the "CUPA Data" section below.

Each point on the graph corresponds on the vertical axis to the dollar difference between UM-Dearborn and CUPA comparison schools average salaries for a discipline category and faculty rank. Discipline categories are arranged in ascending order. The horizontal axis represents the percentile ranking of discipline categories. Thus the "50" on the horizontal axis is the fiftieth percentile or median of the ranked discipline categories.

To illustrate: the first (lowest) point on the "Full Professor Salaries" graph is the CUPA discipline category Economics. The graph shows that the average salary for full professors of Economics at UM-Dearborn is more than \$37,000 below the average salary for professors of Economics in schools of Arts, Sciences, and Letters at the CUPA comparison universities. The fiftieth percentile or median discipline categories for full professors are Physics and Sociology. The average salaries of full professors in these two faculties are about \$10,500 below faculties in the same CUPA discipline categories. To find a particular discipline, go to the "Graph Data Ranked" section of the printed report.

Referring to the "All Ranks Graph" (fourth graph), the issue of salary compression at UM-Dearborn becomes evident. This graph shows professors, associate professors, and assistant professors. The median discipline category salary for assistant professors (Anthropology and Sociology) is about \$1,100 below the CUPA comparison

salaries. The median discipline category salary for associate professors (Communication & Media Studies and German) is about \$3,700 below the CUPA equivalent. As mentioned, the median discipline category salary of full professors (Physics and Sociology) is \$10,500 below the CUPA equivalent.

We would not expect UM-Dearborn average salaries to equal CUPA average salaries in every discipline category. We would, however, expect median UM-Dearborn salaries to be close to their CUPA equivalents. This is nearly true at the assistant professor level. Not surprisingly, UM-Dearborn tends to hire new assistant professors whose overall average salaries are roughly comparable to market averages, albeit with significant variation across disciplines. We are all aware of the national trend toward salary compression at higher ranks. Disturbingly, the graphs show that salary compression at UM-Dearborn is significantly worse than salary compression in the CUPA comparison schools. Associate and full professors at UM-Dearborn receive salaries well below associate and full professors at other universities.

### **Recommendations**

Without referring to salaries of individual faculty and acknowledging significant variation between disciplines, the Committee recommends as a first step raising the entire distribution of associate professors and of full professors so that their position relative to comparison universities is the same as that of assistant professors.

To raise the distribution of Associate Professors up to be similar to Assistant Professors would require about \$2700 per associate or about \$270,000 total for the roughly one hundred Associate Professors. To do the same for the Professors would require about \$9400 per Professor for the roughly seventy Professors or about \$658,000 total. Thus, a first pass estimate of the cost of redressing the faculty salary equity problem at UM-Dearborn is about \$928,000. The CUPA data omits librarians and curators. However, appropriate allowances should also be made for these faculty members. The Committee recommends this expenditure immediately. Further, the Committee urges a continued vigilance concerning salary equity across faculty ranks.

The UM-Dearborn Faculty Senate also asked the CESF to estimate the cost of raising the salaries only of those faculty “on the left tail” of the distributions, that is, faculty who are paid at a rate below the CUPA comparison rates. This calculation is shown on the right two columns of the “Graph Data Ranked” table. Items in the first of the two columns calculate the difference between UM-Dearborn and CUPA average salaries and multiply the result by the number of faculty in the discipline category. The total estimated cost is shown at the top of the last column: \$1,416,291. Note that this number does not include UM-Dearborn faculty omitted from the CUPA tables because of insufficient comparable data. Importantly, librarians and curators are omitted from this estimate as well.

The CESF acknowledges differences in opinion about which of the two strategies above is more appropriate. These differences center on the relative importance of merit and historic vagaries of the market in determining salary patterns over time. The CUPA data do not provide sufficient information to resolve this issue. We trust that individual units have sufficient information and can distribute funds equitably.

### **Medicare Part B Reimbursement**

Along with the CESF in Ann Arbor, the UM-D CESF strongly opposes the proposal to discontinue the Medicare Part B reimbursement program for retired employees. We see this as an unacceptable and unexpected change in the University's longstanding compensation package.

### **CUPA Data**

Data used in the graphs come from the *National Faculty Salary Survey: Multi-Discipline Report 2005-2006* produced by the College and University Professional Association for Human Resources (CUPA)

The CUPA survey has the important advantage of providing salary information by rank and by discipline category. CUPA discipline categories are usually, but not always the same as the disciplines or departments within colleges here at UM-Dearborn. For example, CUPA discipline categories are unrelated to School of Engineering administrative disciplines and CUPA discipline categories are similar but not identical to School of Management administrative departments.

Some faculty are not represented in the graphs because insufficient CUPA comparison data are available for their discipline category. CUPA does not provide comparison data for librarians and curators. In addition, the Chemistry and the Teacher Ed & Prof Dev, Subjects discipline categories are omitted for full professors because the single UM-D full professor in each of those discipline categories has a full-time administrative appointment.

Not all universities in Michigan (or in the region) participate in the CUPA survey, so the choice of comparable institutions is constrained. In addition, not all Michigan universities (or other potential comparable universities) who participate in the CUPA survey have schools of Engineering, Management, and Education. UM-Ann Arbor did not participate last year but did participate this year. That, and at least one other

difference in the CUPA list of comparable universities mean results from this year's and last year's CESF reports are not strictly comparable although the pattern of salary compression remains the same.

The CESF acknowledges that the decision to include UM-Ann Arbor in the list of CUPA comparison schools is controversial. Certainly UM-Ann Arbor salaries are higher than UM-Dearborn salaries on average, although the difference is much less significant at the assistant professor level than at the associate and full professor levels. On the other hand, UM-Dearborn is part of The University of Michigan system and UM-Ann Arbor incorporates UM-Dearborn in statistical reports when doing so is advantageous. Further, the list of comparable universities includes some we would regard as inferior in terms of ability to recruit faculty. The committee weighted the latter arguments more heavily than the former in deciding to include UM-Ann Arbor as one of the comparison universities.






## Full Professor Salaries




## Associate Professor Salaries












