Subject: Report of Faculty Retirement

Action Requested: Adoption of Retirement Memoir


Ronald F. Maio D.O., M.S., professor of emergency medicine, Medical School; assistant research scientist, University of Michigan Transportation Institute; and director, Office of Human Compliance Review, will retire from active faculty status on June 30, 2013.

Dr. Maio received his B.S. degree from Regis College in 1972, his D.O. degree from Michigan State University (MSU) in 1976, and his M.S. degree from the University of Michigan in 1988. From 1976-77, he completed a rotating internship at Botsford-Zieger Hospitals. Dr. Maio completed his emergency medicine residency (1981-83) and served as chief resident, Department of Emergency Medicine (1982-83) at MSU affiliated hospitals. He joined the University of Michigan as an instructor in 1989, and was promoted to assistant professor in 1992, associate professor in 1996, and professor in 2003. He received additional appointments of assistant research scientist in the University of Michigan Transportation Institute in 1992 and professor of environmental health sciences in the School of Public Health from 2001-09. Dr. Maio served as assistant dean for research regulatory affairs in the Medical School (2004-06) and director of the Office of Human Research Compliance Review under the Office of the Vice President for Research (2006-13).

Dr. Maio's research and teaching interests focused on the prevention and treatment of traumatic injuries, the effectiveness of emergency medical services systems, and the relationship of alcohol and drugs to traumatic injury. He has co-authored over 100 research and clinical articles. Dr. Maio was a major contributor in the development of the innovative Pediatric Emergency Care Applied Research Network and was the principal investigator of the Emergency Medical Systems Outcomes Project funded by the National Traffic Safety Administration. Dr. Maio was a dedicated mentor of students, residents, fellows, and faculty, and played an instrumental role in the success of the Department of Emergency Medicine.

The Regents now salute this distinguished faculty member for his dedicated service by naming **Ronald F. Maio professor emeritus of emergency medicine and assistant research scientist emeritus**.
