Subject: Kent Health Care Physician Organization (KHCPO) legal assessment and

recommendations

Action

Requested: Approval of dissolution and establishment of UMHW as sole owner

## Background:

Kent Health Care Physician Organization (KHCPO) formed in 1995 and was focused on quality and payer contracting as outlined in their bylaws. KHCPO represents 371 physician shareholders across West Michigan; 61% of the shareholders are independent physicians. There are no allocated staff or resources with the operational responsibilities aligned to four Board Officers. Currently, KHCPO owns 50% of the Clinically Integrated Network (CIN) called Metro Health Integrated Network (MHIN) in partnership with University of Michigan Health-West (UMHW).

In late 2023, MHIN and UMHW conducted an assessment in which they determined that it was in the best interests of the parties to close KHCPO, creating a hospital subsidiary CIN model in which UMHW is the sole owner of MHIN. This is considered a market "best practice" model. The goal of the new model is to empower provider voice by having a provider led governance structure that is charged with provider accountability and performance for the value-based future. Importantly, this model for joint payer contracting provides the ability for growth for MHIN.

We <u>recommend</u> that the Board of Regents approve the dissolution of KHCPO making UMHW the sole owner of MHIN, which has already been unanimously supported by the U-M Health Corporation Board and the KHCPO Board.
