Action Requested: Adoption of Retirement Memoir


Linus A. Bieliauskas, Ph.D., professor of psychology in the Medical School and professor of psychology in the College of Literature, Science and the Arts, retired from active faculty status on July 31, 2022.

Professor Bieliauskas received his B.S. degree from Xavier University (Ohio) in 1970, his M.S. degree from Ohio University in 1973, and his Ph.D. degree from Ohio University in 1976. He served his internship in clinical psychology at the University of Florida from 1975-1976. He joined the faculty at the University of Michigan as an associate professor in 1989, and was promoted to professor in 2013. He also served as training director in the Neuropsychology Section of Psychiatry from 1990-2020.

He is board certified in both clinical psychology and clinical neuropsychology by the American Board of Professional Psychology (ABPP) and is a fellow of the American Psychological Association (APA), the Michigan Psychological Association, and the Midwestern Psychological Association. He was president of the International Neuropsychological Society (1992-1993) and of the Society of Clinical Neuropsychology (Division 40 of APA; 1997-1998). He served as executive director for the American Board of Clinical Neuropsychology and the American Academy of Clinical Neuropsychology for over 30 years. He was the senior editor of the journal *Aging, Neuropsychology, and Cognition* (1999-2017), and is the editor of the book series *Neuropsychology, Neurology and Cognition* for the publishers Taylor and Francis. He is the author of two books and numerous book chapters and peer-reviewed articles related to cognitive and affective changes due to normal and abnormal aging and treatment response in patients with chronic illness and disease. He is the co-editor of the *Oxford Handbook of History of Clinical Neuropsychology*. Dr. Bieliauskas has also been involved in developing training models in clinical neuropsychology and clinical psychology. He was a member of the Steering Committee, Parliamentarian, and Chair of Plenary Sessions, for the National Conference on Internship Training in Psychology, Gainesville, FL (1987), the National Conference on Scientist-Practitioner Training in Psychology, Gainesville, FL (1990), the National Conference on Graduate Training in Psychology, Salt Lake City, UT, (1987), the Conference on Postdoctoral Training in Applied Psychology, Ann Arbor, MI (1992), and the Houston Conference on Education and Training in Clinical Neuropsychology, Houston, TX (1997).

The Regents now salute this distinguished faculty member by naming **Linus A. Bieliauskas, professor emeritus of psychology, Department of Psychiatry, Medical School.**
