Action Requested: Adoption of Retirement Memoir

Jennifer G. Nastelin, M.D., clinical assistant professor of internal medicine in the Medical School, retired from active faculty status on August 21, 2026.

Dr. Nastelin received her B.S. degree in materials science and engineering from Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Cambridge, MA, in 1986 and her M.D. degree from Harvard Medical School, Boston, MA, in 1990. She completed her postgraduate training in internal medicine at the University of Michigan in 1993. She joined the University of Michigan faculty as a lecturer in 1993, was appointed as a clinical instructor in 1994, and was promoted to clinical assistant professor in 1998.

As an outpatient clinician, Dr. Nastelin provided outstanding care to a large, complex panel of patients, many for over 30 years. Her exceptional patient care was reflected in her high scores on patient satisfaction surveys and in multiple quality-of-care indicators. Dr. Nastelin also taught hundreds of residents and medical students, many of whom are now University of Michigan faculty members. She also mentored junior faculty and nurse practitioners. Dr. Nastelin received the University of Michigan Department of Internal Medicine Excellence in Continuity General Internal Medicine Teaching Award in 2013 as a testament to her teaching excellence. Dr. Nastelin also served on several committees, including the Primary Care Committee and Hypertension Disparity Work Group. In 2023, Dr. Nastelin had the great honor of being inducted into the Internal Medicine Clinical Excellence Society.

The Regents now salute this distinguished faculty member by naming **Jennifer G. Nastelin, MD, clinical assistant professor emerita of internal medicine.**
