Current and Upcoming CSG Programming and Initiatives

Summer Student Funding Dispersal

Since the passage of CSG's summer budget, which was on May 16th, CSG's Student Organization Committee (SOC) has paid for \$17,632.38 worth of student organization activities – totaling roughly 30% of the SOC's total summer budget, which is on track to continue sustainably funding our university's incredible student organizations until the introduction of the fall budget in late September.

Building Connections Across Michigan and Across the Country

CSG, as student representatives of the leaders and best, has taken the lead on establishing the United Michigan Student Governments – a collective of student leaders from Michigan's 15 public universities advocating for improvements in the student experience – specifically as they relate to affordability. Additionally, the Association of Big Ten Schools (ABTS) has chosen a fellow Wolverine, Margaret Peterman, to be their next Executive Director. Margaret is an incoming senior at the Ford School of Public Policy. The University of Michigan's stellar reputation both within Michigan and beyond has fueled CSG to take an advanced role in these statewide and national advocacy organizations.

Introductory Meetings and Prospective Cabinet Appointments

Since the swearing in of Naimah and myself in April, we have met with dozens of administrators and student groups to introduce ourselves and present ourselves as a resource. It is vital for CSG to be forward facing to the students whose duty it is for us to represent. It is additionally important that CSG remain accessible to those corners of the university's large administrative bureaucracy that most lack student input. It is for this reason that the Executive Branch of CSG has already begun appointing cabinet members and other executive officials. CSG is expected to have over 100 students within its ranks, dedicated to the goal of nothing more than improving students' lives and representing their views.
