

U-M RESEARCH AWARD AND EXPENDITURES REPORT  
SEPTEMBER 2021

This report summarizes the overall trends in grant and contract activity across all three campuses of the University of Michigan through the first month of Fiscal Year 2022, which ended July 31.

Total research expenditures through the first month of FY22 totaled \$146 million, which is up 5 percent when compared to the first month of FY21.

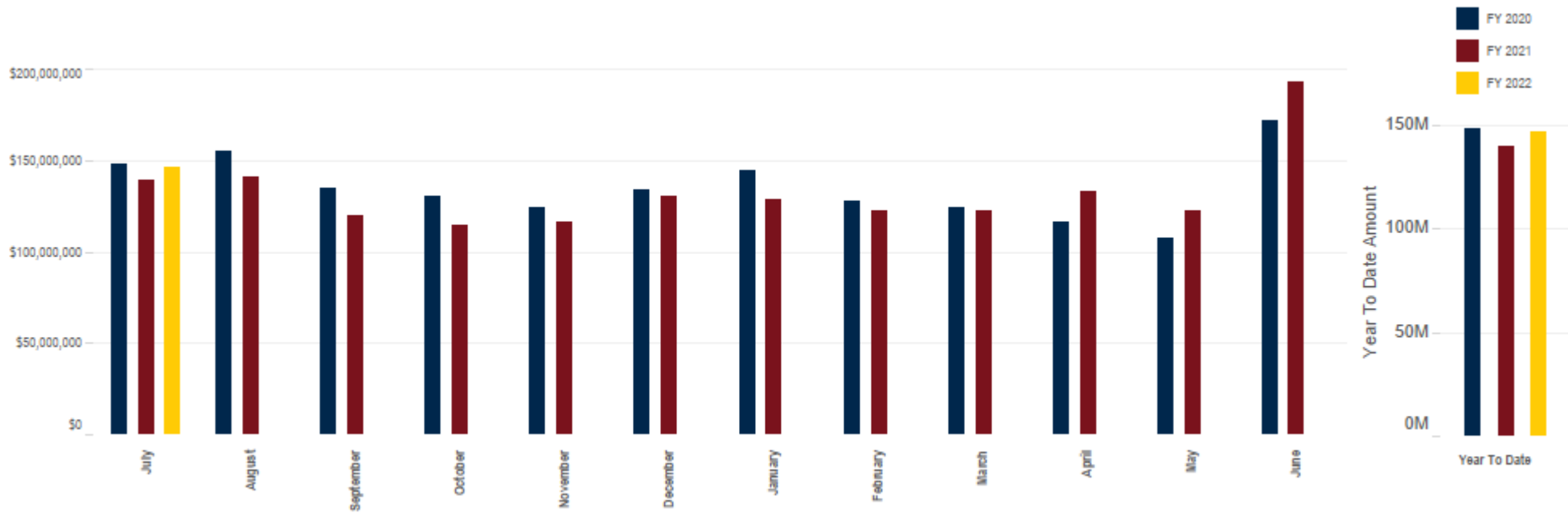
The number of research submissions through the first month of FY22 was up 3.5 percent, but the value of those submissions decreased by 11.3 percent when compared to July 2020.

The number of new research awards from external sponsors through the first month of FY22 was down 1.9 percent, and their value decreased by 23.6 percent when compared to July 2020. The university received three COVID-related awards totaling \$73 million during July 2020, which helps explain the 23.6 percent dip in research value.

## Expenditures



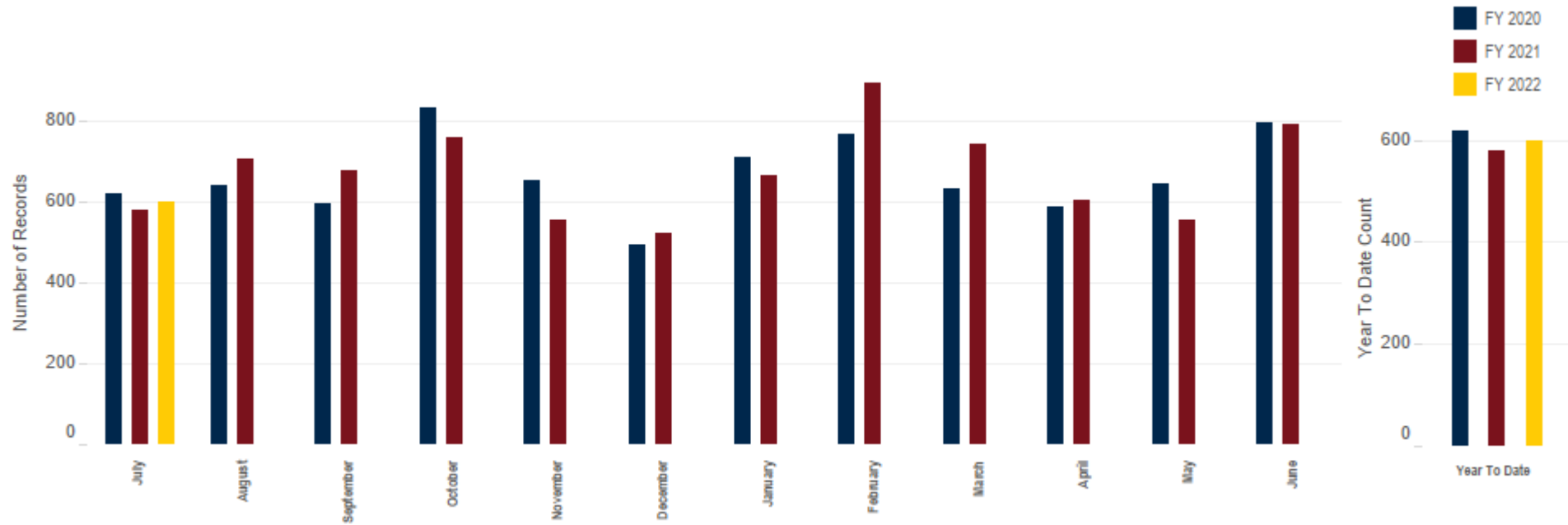

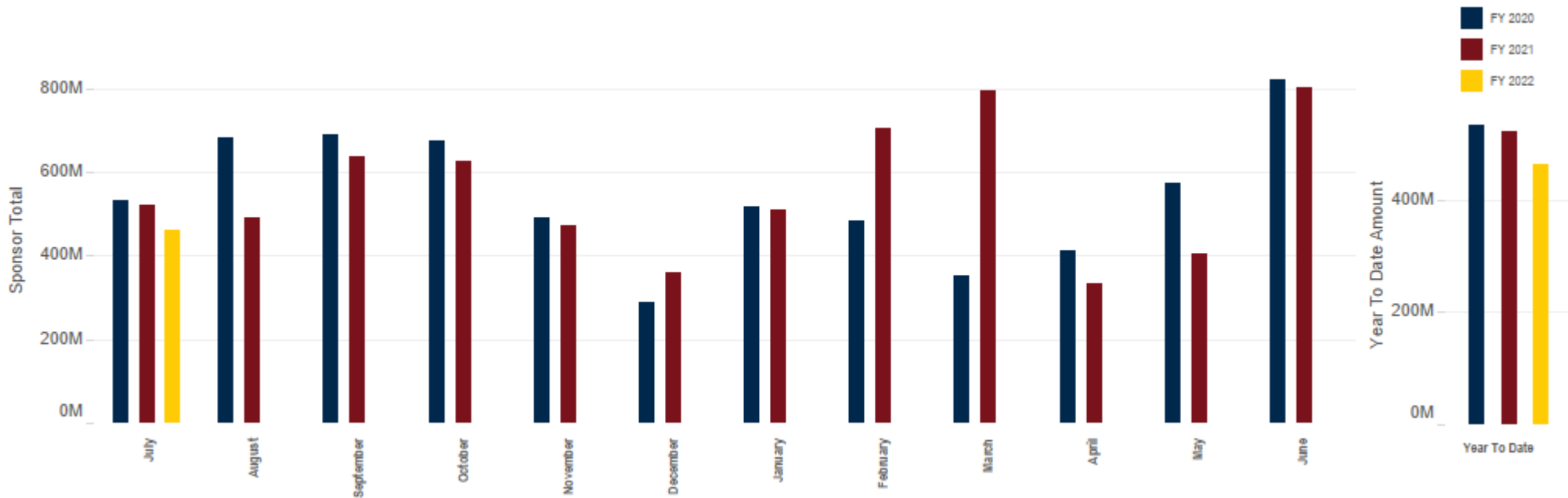
### Submissions by Count

### Submissions by Amount



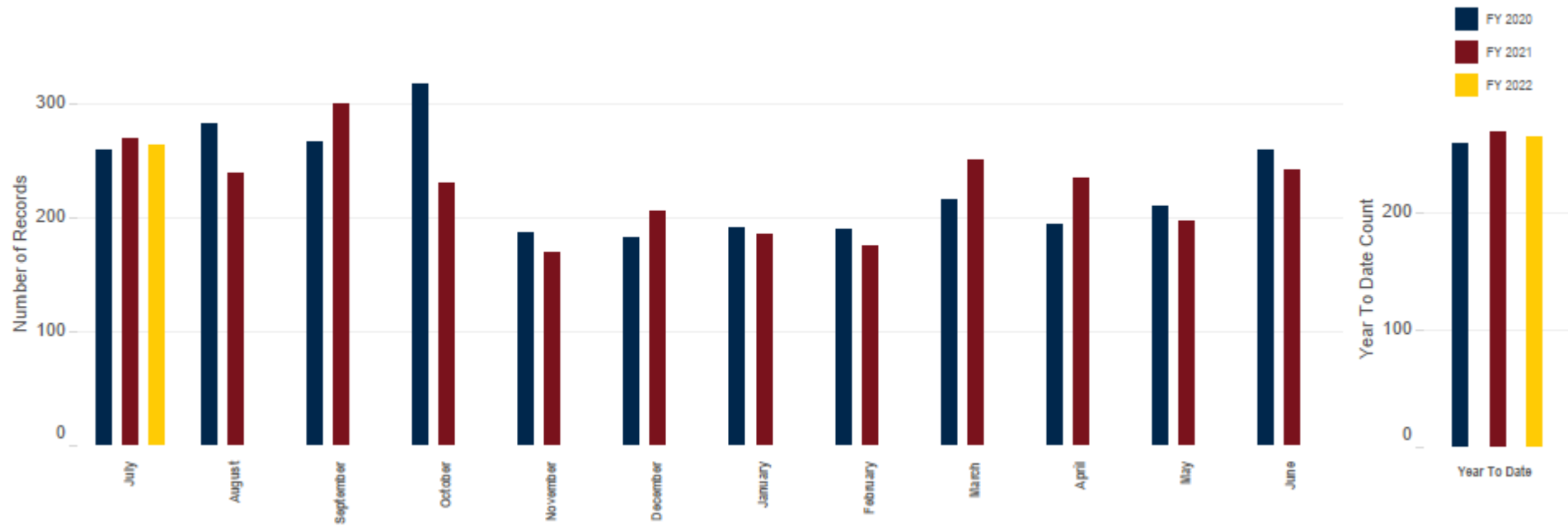

### Awards by Count



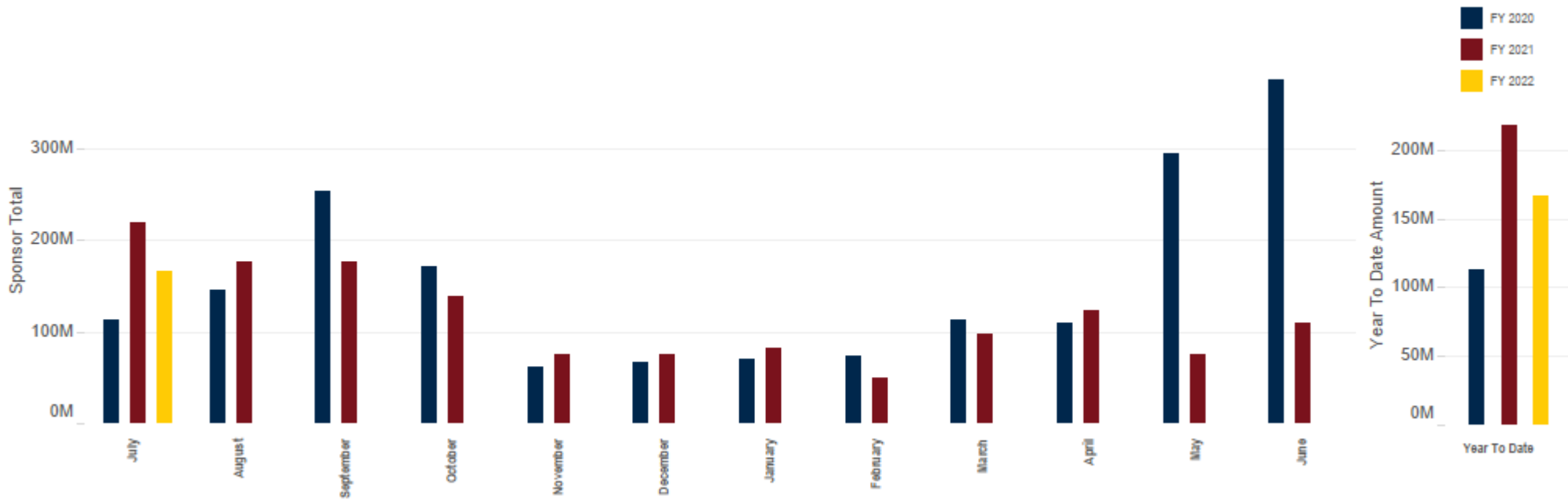
