Action Requested: Adoption of Retirement Memoir

Margie C. Andreae, M.D., chief medical officer revenue cycle and clinical professor of pediatrics in the Medical School, retired from active faculty status on October 1, 2024.

Dr. Andreae received her B.A. degree (1986) from Kalamazoo College and her M.D. degree (1991) from the University of Michigan. She completed a pediatrics internship (1992) at William Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak, one year of fellowship training in dermatology (1993) at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit, and a pediatrics residency (1995) at William Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak before joining the University of Michigan faculty as a clinical instructor in 1995. She was promoted to clinical assistant professor in 1999 and clinical associate professor in 2004. In 2010, Dr. Andreae was promoted to clinical professor of pediatrics, the position from which she now retires.

Dr. Andreae is a nationally recognized pediatrician and expert in clinical documentation, professional billing, and coding compliance. She has been extensively involved in teaching medical students, pediatric house officers and faculty in general pediatric care. Dr. Andreae has received numerous national and institutional awards, including America's Top Pediatricians, Consumer's Research Council of America, the Department of Pediatrics's Top 10% Teachers for several years, and the University of Michigan Medical School's League of Clinical Excellence inductee. She has served on several national committees, including as chair of the American Academy of Pediatrics' Committee on Coding and Nomenclature and member of the American Medical Association's Relative Value Update Committee (RUC). She has held important institutional administrative roles, including associate chair for Finance and Billing Operations in the Department of Pediatrics, and chief medical officer, Revenue Cycle and Billing Compliance, University of Michigan Hospitals and Health Centers. Dr. Andreae has published over 30 peerreviewed articles and has served as *ad hoc* reviewer for many top tier journals including *Lancet*, Human Vaccines, and Journal of Pediatrics. She has served as editor, American Academy of Pediatrics' "Coding for Pediatrics," and editor in chief, Editorial Advisory Board for Coding Publications, American Academy of Pediatrics. Dr. Andreae's contributions to the division, the Department of Pediatrics and Michigan Medicine are outstanding.

The Regents now salute this distinguished clinician, scholar, and administrator by naming Margie C. Andreae, clinical professor emerita of pediatrics.
