Subject: Report of Faculty Retirement

Action Requested: Adoption of Retirement Memoir

John E. Marcotte, Ph.D., archivist, Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research, Institute for Social Research, retired from active faculty status on August 4, 2025.

Dr. Marcotte received his B.J.S. degree in 1978, his M.S. in 1984, and his Ph.D. in 1988. He received his bachelor's degree from Northwestern University and his master's and doctorate from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Dr. Marcotte joined the University of Michigan in 2011 as an archivist in the Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research (ICPSR) at the Institute for Social Research (ISR). Since 2017, he has also served as an adjunct clinical instructor in the University of Michigan's School of Nursing and has had affiliations at the Michigan Institute for Data Science (MIDAS) and the Health Analytics Collaboratory.

Dr. Marcotte has made numerous important contributions to the University of Michigan and to the fields of demography, data archiving, and data security. At ISR, Dr. Marcotte served as the principal investigator and project director of Data Sharing for Demographic Research (DSDR). DSDR is the primary research data sharing program for the National Institute for Child Health and Human Development. Dr. Marcotte also served in a leadership role on the National Archive for Computerized Data on Aging (NACDA), the similar program for the National Institute on Aging. In addition to leading these two major archival initiatives and numerous related projects, Dr. Marcotte served as the director of the restricted data repository for the National Health and Aging Trends Study (NHATS). Dr. Marcotte has been a long-time member of the Population Association of American (PAA) and the American Statistical Association (ASA). He served as chair of the PAA's Computer Advisory Committee, served on numerous review panels at the National Science Foundation and National Institutes of Health, and he is currently co-editor of the journal *JMIR-Aging*.

The Regents now salute this distinguished faculty member by naming **John E. Marcotte, archivist emeritus, Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research**.
