

U-M RESEARCH AWARD AND EXPENDITURES REPORT
OCTOBER 2021

This report summarizes the overall trends in grant and contract activity across all three campuses of the University of Michigan through the second month of Fiscal Year 2022, which ended August 31.

Total research expenditures through the second month of FY22 totaled \$296 million, which is up 5.6 percent when compared to the second month of FY21.

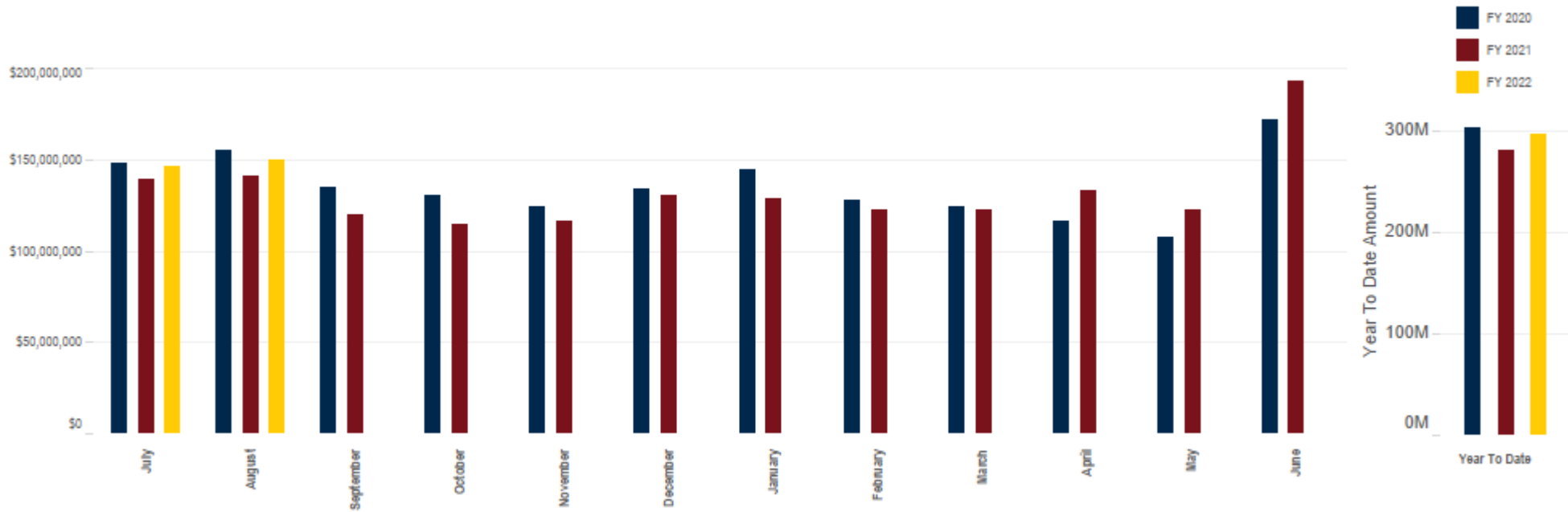
The number of research submissions through the second month of FY22 was down slightly (0.5 percent), and the value of those submissions decreased by 11.7 percent when compared to August 2020.

The number of new research awards from external sponsors through the second month of FY22 increased by 8.5 percent, but their value decreased by 15.1 percent when compared to August 2020. This dip in award value can be attributed to three COVID-related awards totaling \$73 million that U-M received during July 2020.

Expenditures



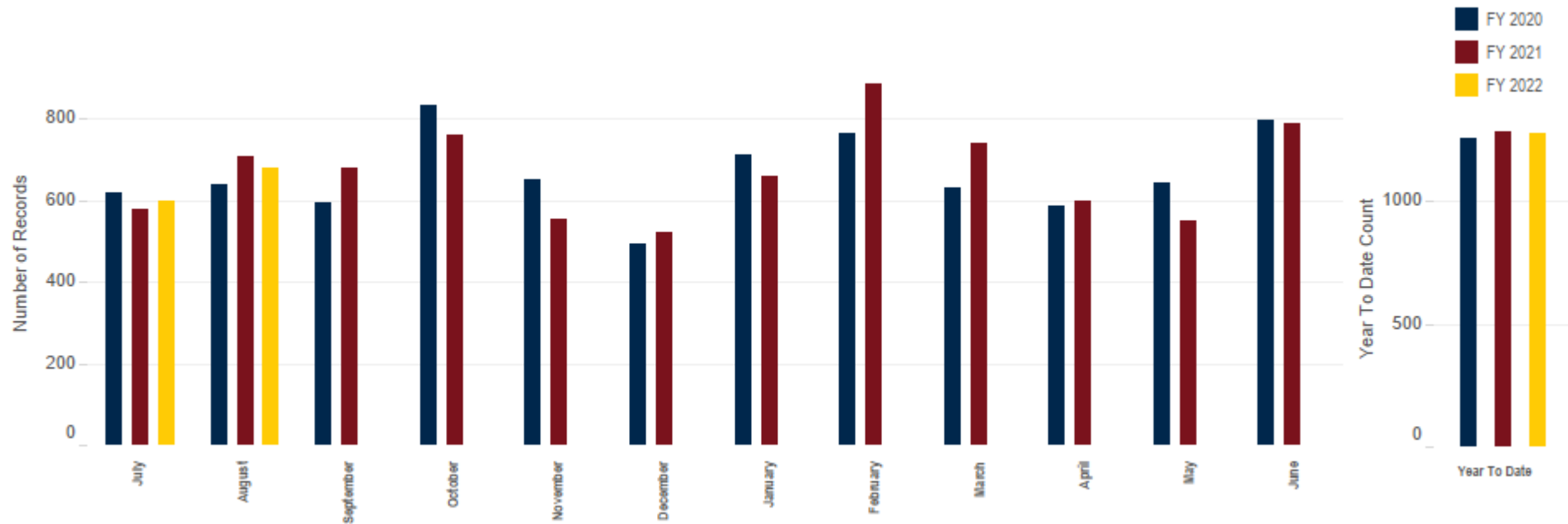

Submissions by Count



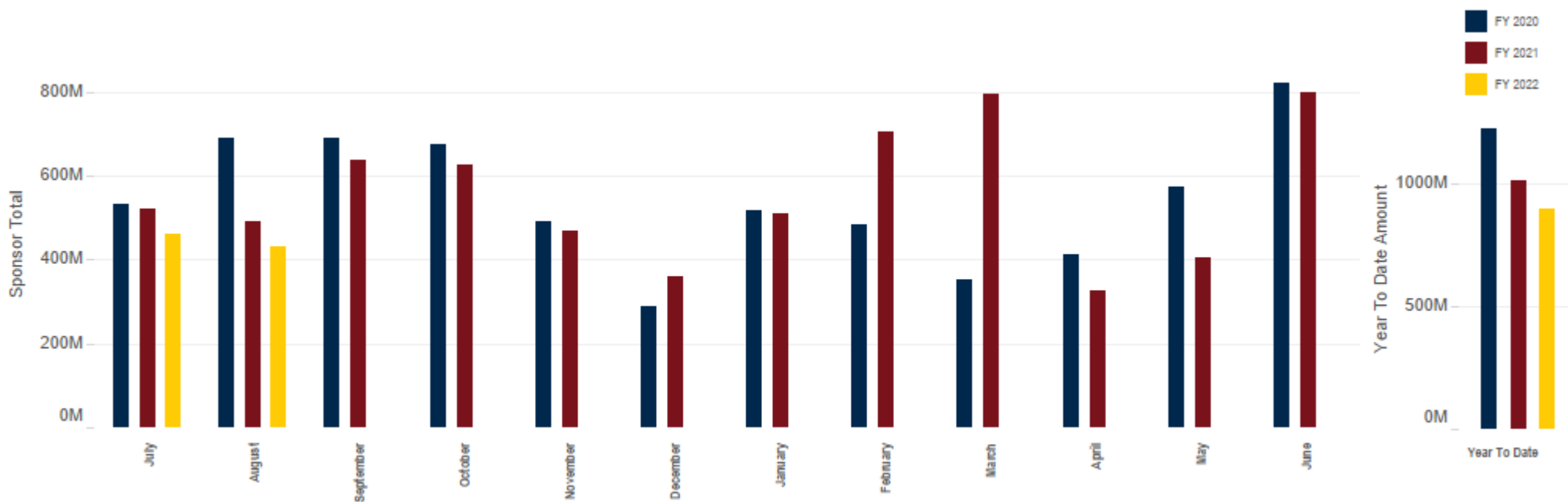

Submissions by Amount



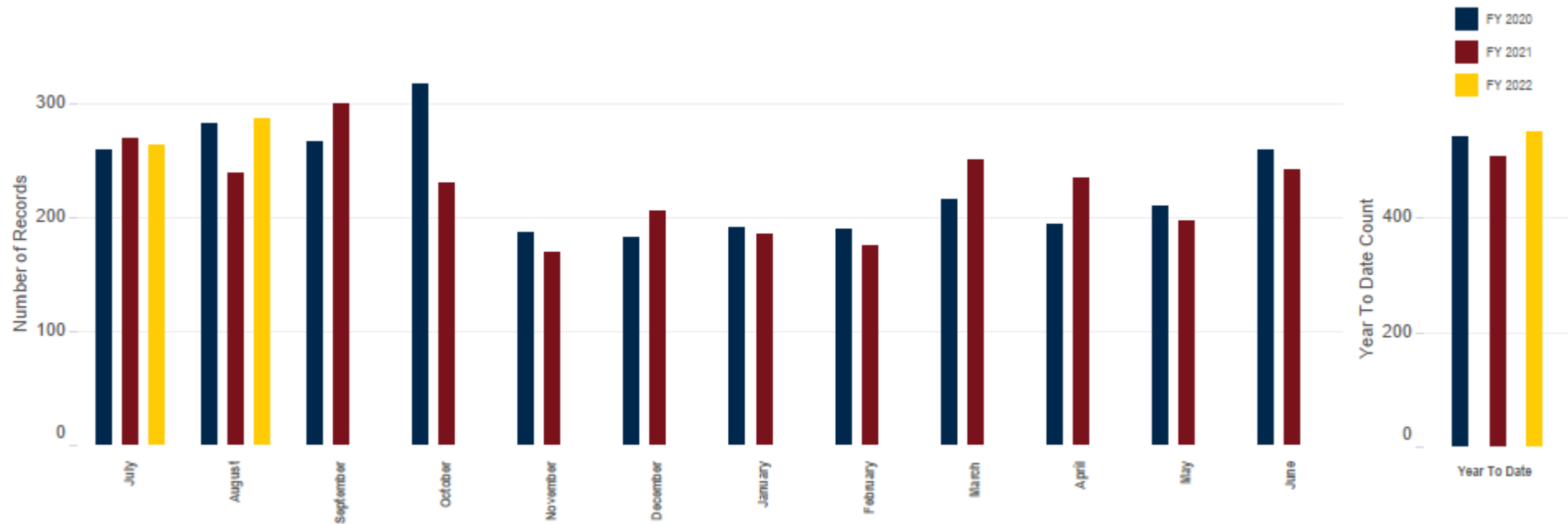

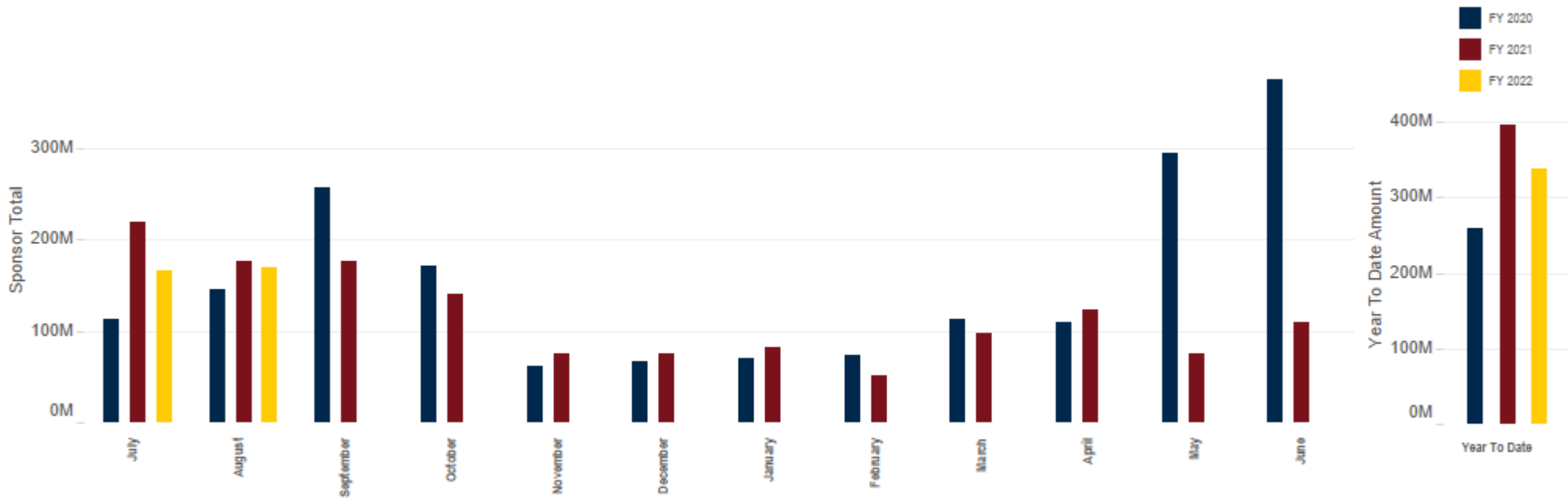
Awards by Count
