Proposed Name: Samuel and Jean Frankel Cardiovascular Center

Background:


A major commitment from an anonymous donor will help support the design and construction of an approximately 25,000-square-foot space in Troy to provide outpatient cardiovascular services. The new facility will expand the collaborative, innovative approach of the existing cardiovascular center in Ann Arbor, which this year is celebrating 25 years of success in uniting medical disciplines to advance cardiovascular care, research, and education.

The Samuel and Jean Frankel Cardiovascular Center in Ann Arbor is a nationally recognized leader in the treatment of heart and vascular conditions, the world's leading cause of death. Multidisciplinary teams are advancing innovative diagnostic tools, less-invasive treatments, and new therapeutic medications. The center also leads a statewide, coordinated cardiovascular network.

The new Troy center will bring leading-edge cardiovascular care and preventive programs to all Michigan Medicine patients and expand our services for communities in metropolitan Detroit.

In acknowledgment of the extraordinary generosity of the anonymous donor and in accordance with their wishes, we recommend that the Board of Regents approve naming the facility the Samuel and Jean Frankel Cardiovascular Center, effective immediately.


