Action Requested: Adoption of Retirement Memoir

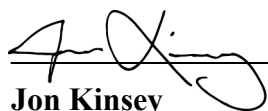
Mark J. Lowell, M.D., clinical associate professor of emergency medicine in the Medical School, retired from active faculty status on November 30, 2025.

Dr. Lowell completed his M.D. degree at New York University School of Medicine in 1986. He then completed an internship in internal medicine at Emory University in 1987, followed by a residency in internal medicine in 1989. Dr. Lowell joined the faculty at the University of Michigan in 1992, appointed as a clinical lecturer in the Department of Emergency Medicine. In 2001, he was appointed to clinical assistant professor and has been a clinical associate professor since 2005. In addition, Dr. Lowell also served as an attending physician at both Hurley Medical Center and Foote Hospital.

During his time here, Dr. Lowell has been a dedicated leader, mentor, and clinician. He has served as the medical director for Survival Flight since 1994, as well as the medical director for the medical station in the Department of Athletics since 1997. Dr. Lowell is also the attending staff scheduler for adult emergency services, a role he has held since 1997. He is also the associate fellowship director for emergency medical services and is an MPLAN director for survival flight. Dr. Lowell has been a leader within adult emergency services and survival flight, mentored many learners throughout his career, and has been instrumental in helping further the clinical goals and mission of the department.

The Regents now salute this distinguished faculty member by naming **Mark J. Lowell, clinical associate professor emeritus of emergency medicine.**
