Redefining Student Government

For over a century the student government at the University of Michigan has worked diligently, advocating for the interests of students and working to maintain the quality of excellence that defines our institution. Today, we continue that work by providing funding for student organizations, transportation services for students traveling over breaks, voter registration and education for incoming freshmen, encouragement for more sustainable practices, challenges to uphold our commitment to social justice and equality, innovative ideas to enrich our educational experiences, resources to keep students safe on and off campus, and tools to help students establish healthy lifestyles.
