**Glenda Radine, A.M.,** senior associate librarian in the University Library, will retire from active faculty status on December 5, 2014.

Ms. Radine received her B.A. degree from San Jose State University in 1968 and her A.M. degree from the University of Michigan in 1976. She joined the University of Michigan as a program assistant in the Institute of Continuing Legal Education in 1977. She held positions with the University Extension Service, University Housing, and Academic Outreach prior to joining the University Library where she served as assistant director for public affairs, public relations manager, senior public services manager, and senior associate librarian since 2012.

Ms. Radine played an instrumental role in the success of the Digital Media Commons. She provided individualized and customized project management expertise to faculty, staff, and students. These collaborations empowered users to creatively utilize the Common's world class resources, technologies, and facilities to further advance their teaching, research, and academic coursework. Ms. Radine was actively involved in a number of operational activities including outreach programs, marketing and promotion campaigns, financial oversight, facilities, and staffing. Her scholarly publications include research on transformative learning space design, experiential learning, higher education administration, and continuing education. Ms. Radine was actively involved in the campus community and served on numerous committees including the Academic Services Board and The President's Council, State Universities of Michigan.
